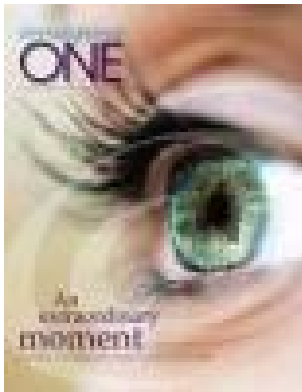


St. Joseph sisters launch new publication
