And, there are not many bishops who would say that they stayed out of some of the meetings precisely so that the Spirit could be discerned by the people of God, not merely wait for the bishop to tell them what to do. I confess my bias, but talks like this confirm it: Bishop Cupich is one of the outstanding bishops in the United States today.
